Life Line Outreach Ministries, located at 2014 Raleigh Road in Henderson, is a shelter and safe haven for women and children who are homeless. Founded in 1984 by Pastor Dorothy Hunt, Life Line serves as a shelter serving Vance, Granville, Warren and Franklin counties. The goal of Life Line is to provide homeless women with emergency housing, food, clothing, counseling and supportive services. Janice Hargrove who is the director, says the shelter is always in need of dish detergent, bleach, paper products, Clorox, soap and towels.

Central Regional Hospital provides treatment for patients of all ages suffering from psychiatric disorders. They strive to provide normalcy and a home-like atmosphere through the activities they provide for the residents. They have a wish list. This is a general sampling: body wash, shampoo, toothpaste, deodorant, playing cards including Uno & Skip Bo, coloring books, word search, markers, journals – no wire, nerf balls. You may bring to CCM & I'll see to it that your donation is delivered. The remainder of the wish list will be included in next month's newsletter.

By participating in the **Baptist Children's Home Food Round Up**, we not only help meet food needs but we also share the love of Jesus with the children who live in these homes. Gift cards, especially to stores like Walmart and Food Lion, will help purchase perishable food items and other supplies. If your church prefers to collect the non-perishable foods and cleaning supplies, the Home has a wish list that I have attached to this newsletter. Pack like items together in small boxes. Do not mix foods with cleaning supplies. Any size can is acceptable. Check expiration dates and discard if outdated. Drop off at the Flat River Office.
